Kolkata – 700032 FACULTY OF SCIENCE DRAFT EXAMINATION RULES FOR UG SCIENCE (FOR CBCS SYLLABUS)

- 1. To be eligible to appear at a University Examination in the Faculty of Science, a student must have satisfied the condition as laid down in clause no. 40 of the First Regulation subject to a minimum of 75% attendance in the classes in each semester and also must have passed all sessional papers if any separately as laid down in clause no. 80 of First Regulation.
 - The eligibility clause will be taken into account only at the end of the each semester (before semester examinations Form fill up).
- 2. No student shall be permitted to appear at any course/paper at the Bachelor's degree examination after completion of five years from admission to 1st year 1st semester class.
- 3. The Bachelor of Science Examination shall be held in six Semesters as follows:

1st semester and 2nd semester for the 1st year students.

1st semester and 2nd semester for the 2nd year students.

1st semester and 2nd semester for the 3rd year students.

4. **Duration for examination** on each course/paper for the Bachelor's examination:

- 5. A student can carry any number of papers in which he/she failed, to next semester. There shall be automatic progression at the end of each semester of 1st year and 2nd year respectively and 3rd year 1st semester irrespective of the marks obtained in the previous semester examination subject to the eligibility conditions as laid down in clause (1) for appearing at the examination being satisfied.
 - Students failing in one or more papers of any semester examination of odd and even semester shall be eligible to clear these papers in the corresponding semester examinations to be held in subsequent years. Such examinations will be called *Repeat Examination* for those students who failed. The maximum number of Repeat Examinations a student can avail of being governed by clause (2).

A student who will not appear in any examination with or without filling up the examination form ,will be considered as failed in that subject and his/her appearance in the exam of that paper/course in next chance will be treated as repeat exam

6. The distribution of papers in the B.Sc. Examination will be governed by the BOS.

7. Pass marks in each paper of Major and Minor courses will be 40% of total marks for the paper concerned. Candidates securing 60% marks or above in aggregate in the Major Courses/Papers of all semester examinations together will be placed in the First class, provided they have cleared all the Minor Papers/Courses of all the semesters. Candidates securing 40% or more but less than 60% in Major courses, of all the semesters together will be placed in the second class provided they have cleared all the Minor Papers/Courses of all the semesters together.

Even having highest marks in aggregate of Major courses only, no medal will be awarded if the student pass any paper in repeat exam as laid down in clause 5 and his/her name will be placed in the merit rank, below the candidates of the same class who have passed all the papers in first chance in regular examination.

8. For B.Sc, there will be Special Supplementary/Repeat Examination of the subjects of 3rd year 1st semester & 3rd year 2nd Semesters only in which the student have failed but have no back paper in 1st & 2nd academic years are eligible to sit the special supplementary /repeat examinations.

General Rules:

- 9. The following procedure shall be followed at the Bachelor's degree examination:
 - i) Each question paper for theoretical course will be set by internal paper setter(s) and the answer script will examined preferably by the same paper setter(s).
 - ii) Moderation of the paper(s) will be done by the Departmental Examination Committee as provided in the clause 37 of the First Regulation.
 - iii) Students will be awarded grades and credit-points. In each semester the mark-sheet/grade card will contain grade awarded per paper/course and the SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average) for both Major & Minor subjects separately .Students having E grade in any subject means failed in that subject and he/she has to reappear in that subject in repeat examination as mentioned in clause no. 5.
 - In the final semester Grade Card, absolute percentage of marks of all semesters together will also be mentioned along with Grade Awarded per paper/course and also the CGPA (cumulative Grade point average) for both Major and Minor courses separately.

Semsters having weightage for Major courses as follows:

1st semester and 2nd semester for the 1st year - 0.25

1st semester and 2nd semester for the 2nd year -0.30

1st semester and 2nd semester for the 3rd year -0.45

For Minor subjects/courses, all semesters are having equal weightage

v) If a student failed in a sessional paper, he/she have to take readmission in the same year of study in next academic year and has to clear again all the examination as well as sessional papers of the concerned semester like a regular student. However if a student failed in a sessional paper in first semester, he/she may continue the 2nd semester of that academic year.
